
Bible Timeline & Artwork

Wilderness Wandering: The Exodus section includes timeless themes of unwilling leadership, oppression and freedom, miraculous escape, God's providence in the midst of distrust, team-building and gaining ground-rules for good living, including systems insuring equality and justice for all.

Artwork: Moses is one of the most significant characters in the Bible in terms of how many stories are written about him. Snakes are in two Moses stories: one in which Moses challenges the magicians of Pharaoh, and another where Moses heals people from snake bites in the wilderness. Moses' staff is used in many ways - herding sheep, traveling the desert, carrying out God's commands to Pharaoh, splitting the sea, striking rocks for water, and winning battles beyond Egypt. Moses used stones to contain the Ten Commandments that became the backbone of Israel's law.
